NEW INLAND EMPIRE REPRESENTATIVE SEATED ON METROPOLITAN BOARD

Inland Empire water official Michael Camacho took his seat today as a member of the board of directors of the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California.

Camacho represents the Inland Empire Utilities Agency on Metropolitan's 37-member board. He was sworn in as a Metropolitan director last month but was formally seated on the board today. He succeeds Angel Santiago, who had served on the Metropolitan board since February 2009.

Metropolitan board Chairman John V. Foley named Camacho to the board's Engineering and Operations Committee, and Legal and Claims Committee.

Elected to IEUA's Board of Directors in 2008, Camacho represents Rancho Cucamonga and portions of Fontana. He currently is vice president of IEUA's board and represents the agency on the Southern California Water Committee. He also serves as IEUA's alternate representative to the Chino Basin Watermaster and the Regional Sewerage Policy Committee.

Born in Montebello, Camacho is senior vice president of Pacifica Services, a construction and project management company. He is a member of the Pasadena Rotary Club and the Association of California Water Agencies.

Camacho and his wife, Wendie Jo, have four children.
